

Congregational Reporting: 2022 in Review

The Process

Each January our congregations share information about their past year with their diocese and the Province. These statistics are then compiled into an annual report by the Province. The success of this project is thanks to the hard work of our congregations, diocesan administrators, bishops, provincial staff, and volunteers. (See Appendix A for a diocese by diocese look at reporting percentage, attendance, and membership.)

Average Principal Service Attendance (APSA), Membership, and Churches

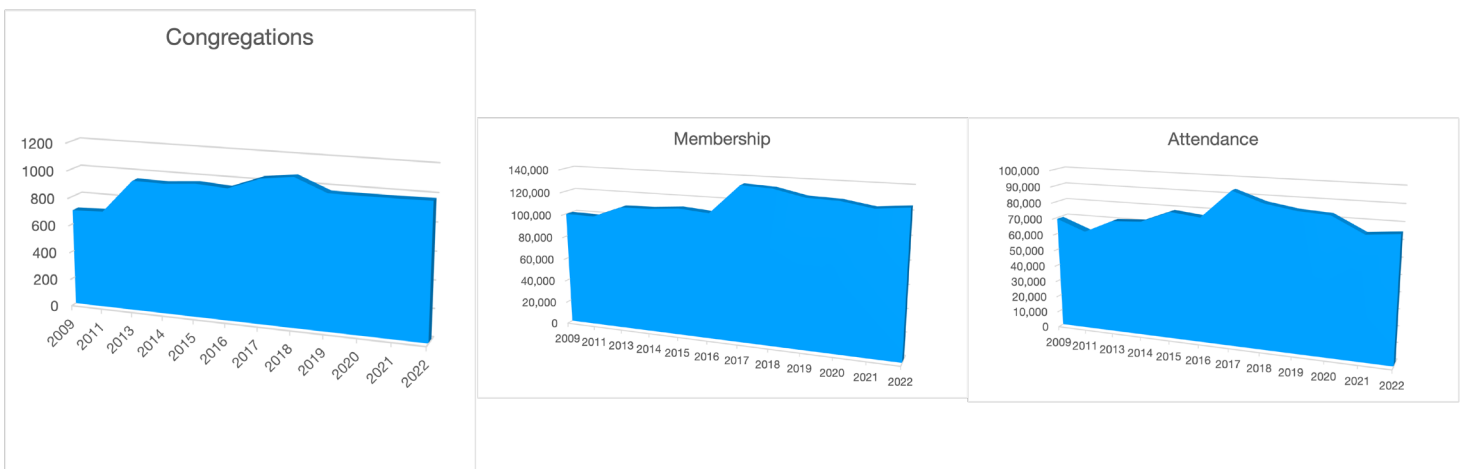
APSA reflects in-person attendance. 2020 and 2021 were challenging years due to the effects of the Covid-19 pandemic. In 2020, APSA was calculated based upon only the months of January and February (pre-pandemic). In 2021 APSA was calculated in two ways: 1) overall APSA 2) APSA for the best two months of the year.

Using the best two months of the year to compare 2021 in-person attendance to the largely pre-pandemic numbers of 2020, an 11% decline was recorded (73,832 in 2021 compared to 83,119 in 2020). Using the data of overall APSA to compare 2021 in-person attendance to the pre-pandemic numbers of 2020, a 30% decline was recorded (58,255 in 2021 compared to 83,119 in 2020).

The year 2022 showed that overall APSA rebounded significantly, though attendance wasn't back to pre-Covid levels. Overall APSA in 2022 was 75,583. This is 30% higher than the overall APSA in 2021 and 2% higher than the best two months of 2021.

Membership increased 2% from 122,450 in 2021 to 124,999 in 2022.

The overall number of churches increased to by three from 974 to 977.



Appendix A: Diocese by Diocese

A diocese's reporting percentage directly corresponds to the confidence that one can have in those numbers. The year to year fluctuations seen in the dioceses in green (90%-100% reporting) closely mirror the actual changes in those diocese.

Diocese in yellow (70% - 89%) and red (<70%) require greater degrees of estimation, and therefore engender a lower level of confidence.
