In the USA, annual distributions to the 13 official seminaries total \$14,500,000 per year, or \$48,900 per graduate ordained in the UMC.

The Central Conference Theological Education Fund was approved for \$10,000,000 for 4 years, or \$2,500,000 per year.

There are about 26 members of the AAUMTI. If all the \$10,000,000 was devoted to Africa, then each institution would average \$96,000 per year, to compare with the \$1,117,000 average for the USA institutions.

Notice the very low number of graduates ordained by many of the official USA 13. Consider how many each Bishop in Africa ordains annually for comparison.
